From the Principal's Desk

By now, you should have received a username and password through the mail, if you submitted an application to obtain access to PowerSchools/Home Base. Home Base will allow you to view grades, progress reports, assignments, and attendance for your student, in real-time. The system is similar to SPAN, which a majority of you are familiar with. As indicated in a phone message a couple of weeks ago, the system has been going down regularly, which is why we delayed implementation at Wakefield High. The Welcome letter and Quick Guide you receive will explain how to create your Parent Portal account. The guide will explain how to access the system and how to create your account. If you completed an application and do not receive information by November 1st, please contact our school. If you have not completed an application, you are encouraged to do so to help you in remaining upto-date on your child's records. More information, including application forms, can be found on our school's website. Students received their access information on October 21st in order to access the system.

This year, Wakefield High is going through the SACs accreditation process. Ms. Dorothy Corrigar, De Laura Inscoe, and Ms. Melissa Thomas serve as the leaders of our school-based team to ensure we complete the necessary requirements as expected. As part of the process, we will be meeting with various stakeholders to gather input on ways to enhance Wakefield. We look forward to communicating with you throughout the year to build upon our outstanding school.

I ad the honor of speaking at the National Honor Society induction ceremony a few weeks ago, and I slared with the inductees the pride I have in them and the school. Most notably, I talked about the passion I have in serving as principal at Wakefield High School. Every morning, I go on the announcements after the Pledge of Allegiance stating, "It's All About the W." It is my hope that by saying this after the announcements on a daily basis, our students will always think about the W when making the choices at school, at home, or within the community. If they always think positive and think about the great things that make up the W, there is a good chance our students will be successful both in and outside the classroom. Important Information!

Students in any grade level can go on college visits or attend college open houses. To set this up, visit the college's website or call their admissions office. Current juniors have earned one college visitation day and seniors have earned two where they can visit four year colleges/military recruiters/community colleges on a school day. A letter from that college must be submitted to the WHS attendance office within two days of the student's return so that the day will not count as an absence.

College Application & Awareness Week is Nov. 18-22. Various speakers, workshops, and activities will take place that week. Counselors will be available in the media center to assist students with college search and applications. Seniors will be able to apply to 58 NC Community Colleges, 31 NC Independent Colleges, and 5 UNC Universities for free that week! Among the colleges waiving their application fee are: Wake Forest, Davidson, Meredith, Wingate, North Carolina Central, NC Agricultural & Technical State University, and many more. For a full listing, please visit the WHS Student Services website.

Counselors, teachers, and community members are working with seniors who need to pass all 8 classes to graduate. This is called the **Graduation Together On Time program**. This is an initiative to support students with academic need, prepare them for life beyond high school, and to increase our graduation rate.

As a reminder, all **mid year graduates** who are beginning college in January need to provide Dr. Inscoe with a college acceptance letter by Dec. 1 in order to be able to begin college in early January. These students will take final exams the week before holiday break and not return after the break.

Mid year graduation is on January 22 at 7 pm in Wakefield High's auditorium.
